3,	Morteza Lankerani and Afrashti (fnu), editor of a Tudeh-front newspaper, will be supported by the Tudeh-front Association for the Freedom of Iran (Jamiyat-e-Azadi Iran). Afrashti will be a candidate from Gilan and Lankerani probably will be a candidate from one of the northern Azerbaijan constituencies. Other possible Tudeh candidates will include Ipakchi (fnu), Dr. Hastarudian (fnu), and Farman Farmayan (fnu).

- Comment. Pamphlets, which were distributed clandestinely throughout Tehran, contained the purported election policy of the Tudeh Central Committee and included the following points:
 - a. Accusations against the National Front of intending to "pack" the new Seventeenth Majlis with National Front deputies by fixed elections prior to reaching an "ignominious compromise with Anglo-American imperialists" in the oil dispute.
 - b. Attacks on alleged National Front terrorist tactics designed to intimidate "the freedom-loving people of Iran" and referring specifically to the 15 July and 6 December 1951 riots.
 - c. Statements that the elections would afford the Tudeh Party an opportunity to mobilize its forces and to test the strength of its national and anti-imperialistic friends; and that this valuable opportunity should not be lost.

The pamphlets did not name preferred candidates but stated only that the Iranian people should vote for peace and democracy, and that Party members should vote only for "national candidates."

Comments, a, Although it has been rumored that certain candidates have the support of the Tudeh Party and it is known that certain other candidates have leftist sympathies or past Soviet connections, it is not definitely known to which ones the Tudeh will give its official support.

b. It is probable that members of the Tudeh Party and of Tudeh fromt organizations will not receive specific voting instructions until immediately prior to the time when voting begins in their respective constituencies, and that such instructions will then be issued clandestinely.

c. It is probable that Tudeh-supported candidates will be members of various front organizations, rather than members of the Party itself. In some instances, candidates may have no known connections with Tudeh-front groups but may have reached a secret agreement with the Party.
